Competition & Honors Overview

The Young Artist Music Competition includes **two performance categories**—the General Competition and the Concerto Competition—as well as a **non-performance honor**, the Feather Spearman Award, which recognizes community service through music.

Students may enter one or more performance categories and may also apply for the Feather Spearman Honor if eligible.

Eligibility

- Open to vocalists and instrumentalists in grades 7-12 enrolled in public, private, or home school.
- Eligible instrument categories: piano, strings, wind, percussion, and voice.

Performance Competition Categories

1. General Competition

Students may compete individually and/or as part of an ensemble. Students entering the General Competition may also enter the Concerto Competition on a different instrument.

• If there are fewer than 4 entries in a category/age group, categories may be combined at the discretion of the competition committee.

Individual Entries

- Soloists may compete on a second instrument within the General Competition (a separate entry form and fee are required for each instrument).
- Individual entrants may also participate in an ensemble.
- Awards by age group (grades 7-9 and 10-12):

1st place: \$150
2nd place: \$125
3rd place: \$100

Ensemble Entries

- Ensembles may consist of 2-5 members.
- Ensemble entrants may also compete individually.
- Awards (awarded to each ensemble member):

1st place: \$1502nd place: \$1253rd place: \$100

2. Concerto Competition

The Concerto Competition is judged separately from the General Competition.

- Repertoire must be a concerto movement, concertino, or showpiece with orchestral accompaniment.
- Students may enter both the Concerto and General Competitions if competing on different instruments.
- Students may compete individually or as part of a 2–5-member ensemble.
- Previous Concerto Competition winners may compete again on a different instrument.
- Maximum performance length: 12 minutes.
- Piano accompaniment is strongly recommended. Competitors should contact an accompanist **at least one month** before the event and rehearse well in advance.
- Awards:

1st place: \$150
2nd place: \$125
3rd place: \$100

 At the discretion of the judges, the winner may be invited to perform their concerto with the Willimantic Orchestra in a 2026 concert.

Special Awards & Honors

1. Musicianship Awards

These awards honor distinguished community members, supporters of the arts, and their families. They are given at the judges' discretion.

- All performing competitors are eligible unless otherwise noted.
- Awards

Mr. D Scholarship Award: \$300 (Grades 7-8 only)

o Bellingham Piano Award: \$500

Gerry String Award: \$200Gerry Wind Award: \$200

McDevitt Voice Award: to be announced

2. Feather Spearman Honor

This community service-based award honors Feather Spearman, who served as competition director for over 20 years. It recognizes one student who has used their musical talent and passion to make a positive impact on their community.

- This award does not require competition performance.
- Eligible service can take place through a non-profit organization, school, faith-based group, health care facility (such as a rehabilitation center, hospital, assisted living facility, or nursing home), or a similar organization.
- All students grade 7-12 are eligible.
- Candidates are interviewed by committee members (parent/guardian required if under 18).
- Recipient is selected by the competition committee.
- No application fee.
- Award: \$200

Performance Guidelines

Time Limits

- General Competition pieces: maximum 7 minutes.
- Concerto Competition pieces: maximum 12 minutes (10-12 minutes strongly recommended).

Vocalists

- Acceptable: art songs (any language), selections from musicals, operettas, operas, and oratorios.
- Not allowed: pop music or original compositions.
- Songs must be developmentally appropriate.

Ensembles

- Must consist of 2-5 performers.
- May include any combination of instruments and/or voices.
- Members may also enter as individuals.

Accompaniment

- Performers are responsible for arranging their own accompanist.
- Two grand pianos are available at the venue.
- Recommended accompanists:
 - o Dr. Priyeshni Peiris Perera 959-929-1392
 - o Richard Cooper 860-371-0807
- Competitors should secure an accompanist at least one month before the event and rehearse well in advance.
- Recorded tracks are not permitted.
- Performers may compete without accompaniment only if their piece allows.

General Information

Attire

To maintain a professional and respectful competition atmosphere, participants should wear formal or semi-formal performance attire. These standards are similar to those required at All-State and collegiate-level performances, making this a valuable opportunity to practice appropriate concert dress.

- Suggested attire: button-down shirts, (ties optional), dresses or blouses with conservative necklines and hemlines, and leggings only with a tunic/dress mid-thigh or longer.
- Not permitted: blue jeans, T-shirts, athletic wear, polo shirts, flip-flops, or sandals.

Schedule

- 1:00 4:00 pm: Competition (Grades 7–9, Grades 10–12, and Concerto division)
- 4:00 pm: Awards Ceremony

Photography & Recordings

- A professional photographer will take photos of participants with parental permission.
- Families and guests may not take photos or videos during performances.

Judging

- Judges will evaluate performances based on technical ability, musical interpretation, and overall artistry.
- Judges' decisions are final.
- Judges reserve the right not to award a prize if the performance standards are not met.

- Each form must be signed by the student and a parent/guardian.
- Deadline: January 14, 2026

Fees

- Performance categories (General or Concerto): \$35 per entry
- Ensembles: \$35 per member
- Second entry on a different instrument: \$30
- Feather Spearman Honor: No fee (performance not required)
