Newest WRAC Board Member - Dan Thomacos



I started my love for the Arts back in the early 1980s working backstage for my sister's ballet programs. I remember working on the scenery that had to be on cue for set changes. I then worked with electronics on sets in high school, working with sound and lights.

In 1988 I was part of a very short-lived TV pilot series Connecticut On Location doing camera work. I've always been good at pantomiming so in 1998 I taught myself puppetry. With help from the Jim Henson Company, the Blue Man Group and a wink from David Letterman, my wife and I created The Not So Late Night Show and teamed up with Robert Laughlin, a professional puppeteer. Since we were breaking new ground, we threw ourselves into the

shows production by building sets, scenery, props and even puppets. Our show branched off to include The Not So Late Fright Show which gave us the opportunity to build full size magic coffins to cannons that blew confetti into the entire audience and building one of the first ever toilet paper guns for our live shows.

We also created three haunted houses, Evil Clowns, Biohazardville, and Night of the Scarecrow that was free to children of all ages. Nearly all of the props for the haunts were built by us.

During this time, I met a vacuum form master in Rhode Island who worked on a couple of Star Wars props, who offered me a piece of equipment for vacuum forming. I spent a few days with him learning all the tricks of the trade. I was hooked seeing what vacuum forming could do. The vacuum form Master has now passed but I carry on his legacy creating amazing props for the world to see.

Featured On the Masthead 14 year old "Accidental Artist", Eli Dyer



In preparation for a youth art show in 2017 when he was 9, Eli and his Mom selected a video on liquid acrylic painting. He collected his supplies, followed the directions, and was disappointed to see that he hadn't quite "nailed it". As he continued to try, he accidentally dropped a canvas face down into the paint and thought



he had ruined it. He squished the canvas around, plucked it up from paint, and discovered that he liked what he saw. This became his unique smoosh technique. Response to his artwork was overwhelming. He sold every piece he made and was asked to create custom pieces and to show again. The "Abstracts by Eli" adventure began.

Since then, Eli has shown his work throughout Eastern Connecticut in galleries, restaurants, festivals, and art shows. He has been invited to the Mystic Outdoor Art Festival as an Emerging Artist on 4 occasions and received an Official Citation from the General Assembly for his involvement with community art.





Establishing and running a business has been an excellent learning experience. Eli re-invests his earnings into his abstract artwork as well as his love for computers and digital art.

The Council is a non-profit volunteer organization with over 250 members. The ArtSpectrum is published three times a year and highlights events and people actively involved in the arts community. The organization that financially supports the Willimantic Orchestra and the Burton Levitt Theater. It sponsors an annual art show for member artists.
